Organization

Cumberland Soil and Water Conservation District was organized in December of 1946. Cumberland SWCD is a locally controlled, special purpose governmental subdivision of the State of North Carolina and is governed by a board of supervisors. The District supervisors are charged with the responsibility of promoting soil and water conservation and establishing conservation programs in the county, which is done primarily through the cooperation of other agencies and local units of government. Members of the Board serve four year terms with three seats being filled in the general election and two seats being appointed by the North Carolina Soil and Water Conservation Commission.
