## One-Stop Early Voting Starts June 3

FAYETTEVILLE – One-Stop Early Voting for the June 22 second primary starts Thursday, June 3 at the Board of Elections office, 301 East Russell Street. Early voting ends at 1 p.m. on June 19. Hours are Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. and on Saturday, June 19 from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m.

There are three run-off races in the primary to determine candidates for the Nov. 2 general election. Democrats will be selecting either Elaine Marshall or Cal Cunningham as a candidate for the U.S. Senate race. All Democrats in the county are eligible to vote for this race. Democrats who reside in N.C. Senate District 21 will choose between Eric Mansfield and Lula Crenshaw in the state senate race. Republicans who live in Congressional District 8 are eligible to vote in the U.S. House race between Harold Johnson and Tim D'Annunzio.

If you are an unaffiliated voter who voted either a Democrat or Republican ballot, then you must vote the same party ballot that you voted in the May primary. If you voted an unaffiliated ballot in May, then you are not eligible to vote in the June primary. If you are an unaffiliated voter and did not vote in the May primary, then you are eligible to vote in the second primary and to choose either a Democrat or Republican ballot.
