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Public Health Information Fair April 27 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

FAYETTEVILLE – The Cumberland County Department of Public Health will host a free information fair April 27 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the main floor lobby of the Public Health Center, 1235 Ramsey St.

The fair is open to the public and will feature display tables with staff to provide information and answer questions. The fair is part of National Public Health Month and National County Government Month, which are both celebrated in April. Services and clinics at the health department include:

- **Care Coordination for Children (CC4C)** – Voluntary program available to all children from birth to 5-years-old with special health, development and social needs.
- **Child Health Clinic** – Provides medical screening for children from birth to age 18 including treatment for sick children, physical exams, developmental, dental, vision and hearing screenings.
- **Communicable Disease Control** – Provides immunizations, screenings for communicable diseases and screenings and treatment for sexually-transmitted diseases.
- **Dental Clinic** – Provides services for children from birth to 20 years of age based on income.
- **Environmental Health** – Inspects food, lodging and institutional places and investigates foodborne illness outbreaks.
- **Maternity Clinic** – Provides early access to prenatal care services to low-income pregnant women.
- **Pregnancy Care Management** – Voluntary program for high-risk pregnant women to assist them in obtaining prenatal care and improved pregnancy outcomes.
- **Pregnancy Test Counseling** – This service provides non-directive, non-judgmental counseling and referrals to appropriate health care providers.
- **School Health Program** – Public health school nurses work in 86 schools in Cumberland County to provide health screenings, assess referrals and manage chronic conditions.
- **Women, Infants and Children (WIC)** – Provides nutrition education and healthy foods to pregnant, postpartum, and breastfeeding women, infants, and children up to age 5.
- **Women's Preventative Health** – Breast Cervical Cancer Control Program (BCCCP) provides breast and cervical cancer screening focused on low-income women 40-64 years of age and Well-Integrated Screening and Evaluation for Women Across the Nation (WISEWOMAN) provides cardiovascular disease screening, intervention, counseling and referrals for BCCCP-enrolled women.
