# 2. Opioid Data & Partner Updates

#### • Review of Overdose Data, ED Visits Data, Fentanyl Report, Louis Leake

- o ED visits have had a 12% overall decrease in the past year.
- o From May 2025 to June 2025, there were 7 more opioid overdose ED visits.
- o There is a higher rate of overdose ED visits in white males age 25-64.
- o In NC there were 892 overdose visits January- June 2025 compared to 1023 January June 2024.
- o Cumberland County is trending upwards in more overdose ED visits.

## • Recovery Housing Support, Lisa Mack

- YTD Jan August financially assisted 25 clients. Out of the 25, 7 clients have been assisted twice. 3 requests are on hold to figure out monthly fees.
- o If the provider asks for second month's assistance, let Lisa know if clients actively receive treatment or are looking for stable employment.

### • Community Paramedic CFV, Tara Tucker

No updates.

### • CTC Opioid Settlement, Louis Leake

- 128 individuals assisted with transportation, 90 assisted with temporary housing, 29 unhoused individuals assisted with tents and other provisions and supplies.
- o 21 individuals have been assisted with utilities.
- o 176 individuals have been assisted food and groceries or connected to resources.
- o 60 individuals have been assisted with prescription fees or other medical supplies/costs.
- 83 individuals have been connected to phone services and 5 individuals have received funding for classes at FTCC.
- o 679 individuals have received assistance with job readiness.

## • CCJS Opioid Settlement, Courtney McCollum

- Re-entry is having a local re-entry council meeting with strategic partners on August 26<sup>th</sup> at DSS from 11am-12pm.
- NC Works has partnered with them to have Re-entry Expo and resource fair at FTCC Tony Rand Student Center on September 4<sup>th</sup>, 10am − 2pm. A flyer will be disseminated.
- Currently in the process of hiring a Family Opiod Treatment Coordinator and hope to have on board mid-September.

## • Healing from Within, Heather Sroka

- o 13 active participants in MAT working with Wellpath medical team.
- o Increased referrals to adult drug court and work court.

## • Mid-Carolina Regional Council, Barbara White - Regina Smith

- o Partnering with Alliance to bring mental health first aid to youth and adults.
- Partnering with The Group Theory and will have a support group for grandparents that bring kids to that organization.
- Partnering with heal holistic to do 6-month session for kinship caregivers that will provide tools for self-care.
- o Youth Mental Health First Aid Training: 8/20/25 at Westover Rec Center.
- NC Certified Peer Support Specialist (CPSS) Training: August 25<sup>th</sup> 30<sup>th</sup> at Mid Carolina.
- o 31 individuals have been CPSS trained so far, 12 are working in caregiving.
- Another CPSS training will be on October 25<sup>th</sup>- 30<sup>th</sup>.

## • Myrover Reese Opioid Settlement, Ivan Pride

- o Currently serving 6 men & 2 women. 26 overall.
- Looking for alternative places to send clients:
  - o Ron Barnes Center for Recovery and Bridge to Tomorrow.
- MOUD update meeting scheduled with life net services, so it can be a one stop shop for clients.
- 1<sup>st</sup> Annual Charity Golf Tournament- October 18<sup>th</sup> at Gates Four Golf and Country Club.
  - All proceeds go to help the recover community at Myrover Reese Fellowship Homes.
- o Myrover Reece 64th Annual Celebration October 25<sup>th</sup>.

### • NCHRC Opiod Settlement/ SIM Taskforce, Charlton Roberson

- o There is no opioid settlement grant data to report.
- From May July outreach workers had 1,040 encounters with individuals in the community.

- o Partnered with Village Pharmacy to do SSP outreach in Grays Creek,
- o SIM: 56 referrals for housing, support, transportation, etc.
- Those qualified for SIM must have criminal justice and substance abuse nexus and must participate in SIM taskforce.

## • Recovery Resource Center, Regina Williams

- o There have been 267 participants since the last CFORT meeting:
  - 11 participants in smart recovery.
  - 27 participants in women for wellness.
  - 2 bus passes were distributed.
  - 8 participants in Recovery Dharma.
  - 4 uber transportation rides scheduled.
  - 3 naloxone training participants.
  - Marius Maximus Social and Emotional Learning case management: 2 participants
  - Leona, peer support specialist, met with 6 clients.
    - 2 needed rental/housing assistance and were referred to Connected Care and SW.
  - 1 client needed linkage service and was connected to the Day Resource Center.
  - Wound care kit making over 100 kits were made.
  - The Recovery Resource Center Partner meeting was July 25<sup>th</sup>.
  - Leona will be doing Smart Recovery for Adults at 12pm every Wednesday.
- Celebrating Recovery Awareness Month on September 5<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>: there will be events from 11-2

#### • RI, Naomi Marshall

### • FSU Xylazine Research, Dr. Luo

- o The surveys were distributed at the end of June.
- o 360 surveys collected.
- Orug samples are slower. Applied for a no-cost one-year extension to continue research.
- o Greg is individually collecting drug samples.
- On't publicly post survey link/qr code. Those who complete the survey will receive e-gift cards.
- Greg has tablets to be used in the field for those to complete surveys on the spot.
- o 30 samples have been collected so far. New presence, medetomidine, has been seen in samples.
- o Withdrawal effects are similar to Xanax.

o Information is public facing on UNC Street Drug Lab website.

## • CCDPH, New Settlement Funds, Dr. Green

- A new round of opioid settlement funds will be presented at the commissioners' meeting on August 25<sup>th</sup>.
- The current settlement funding ends September 30<sup>th</sup>.
- Working on Option B strategies which are: CIT coordinator and Opiod Prevention Education in Schools.

## 3. Overdose Awareness Update, Jessie Garner

#### • Naloxone Saturation Phase One (Complete)

- August 4<sup>th</sup>: Narcan was distributed to 63 individuals and 34 businesses on Bragg Blvd.
- August 11<sup>th</sup>: Narcan was distributed to 20 businesses and 60 individuals on Cedar Creek Rd.
- o August 18<sup>th</sup>: Numbers have not been finalized.
- o Phase Two: Hope Mills, Spring Lake and Grays Creek focus.

## • Awareness Activities Planned (RRC, Ft Bragg, LEEM, FSU, MU)

- Recovery Resource Center Overdose Trainings on Mondays at 10am and Thursdays at 1pm.
- Naloxone Training on August 27<sup>th</sup>, 10am -12pm at LEEM Center in Spring Lake.
