Reentry/SIM Taskforce	 Mario Hardy had concerns regarding families living in hotels and not getting the proper help they need, due to gaps and resources that are not beneficial to families and individuals going through certain situations.

	 Charlton Roberson mentioned creating a subcommittee to share information regarding services for individuals to have a better understanding of how to help. 		
	 Dr. Jennifer Green spoke about data share agreements, so people are aware of the individual's concerns, and this would also be another way to help, knowing what the person is asking for. Dr Green also mentioned emergency housing is limited, and individuals must be able to sustain housing, which is a barrier. 		
Charlton Roberson	 Charlton mentioned there were 39 individuals receiving various services; all had screening done, 22 maintained services for less than 30 days, 17 remain for more than 30 days. The average time of individuals connecting to services has been 7 days or less, 5 of the individuals were related to post overdose response. All 39 individuals received some level of case management. Charlton would like to see people using the link to make referrals to capture data better. August will be compiling due to outcomes measured for the last 60 days on services that's been rendered (Homelessness, mental health and substance abuse.
