SIM Taskforce	 Charlton Roberson - Discussed referrals/SIM link; the SIM link is to Help track data on individuals in need of assistance. Various nationalities are engaging in the system for help; the system provides alternatives for people. October 2025 will show 60–90-day measurement identifying individuals who still engage in services after initial referrals and some of those services are housing and recovery support. Dr. Rita Gunter- wanted to know how housing is found for clients in the county. Charlton stated that they are partnered with various housing vendors.
