September 2019 Director's Report

Community Outreach:



Operation Ceasefire Movie Night (*Captain Marvel*) was held on September 20. Library staff had a table of outreach materials and attended the event with other county departments and local organizations. The Fayetteville Police Department gave a K-9 demonstration and the crowd viewed police vehicles and a fire truck that were on display.

Headquarters Library

Success Stories:

- ★ IS Librarian I Gaby Kienitz helped a customer with information about his family's reunions which included troubleshooting a DVD that was corrupted. The DVD contained home movies of previous family reunions. The customer was so thrilled with her assistance that he invited Kienitz to the next family reunion.
- ★ IS Library Associate Sana Moulder helped a customer find information about his father who was stationed at Fort Bragg in the 1970s. The customer's father was killed on his way to work and he wanted to find out as much information as possible about his father's death. Moulder did extensive research in archived newspapers and on genealogy databases and was able to find an obituary and photographs from his father's high school and college yearbooks. Additionally, Moulder provided the phone number for the Fort Bragg Provost Marshal's Office in case the customer wanted to follow up on the results of the investigation. The customer was deeply grateful for receiving so much information about his father.

Highlights:

The Local & State History Department hosted programs on the life of the pirate *Blackbeard* and also about the contributions of the *Marquis de Lafayette* to the *American Revolutionary War*.

The **Let's Talk About It: Law and Literature: The Eva R. Rubin** series began this month. The program focuses on discussing books as a part of a greater theme, and in September the group discussed Melville's *Billy Budd* and Twain's *Pudd'nhead Wilson*.



The program **A Walk through Architectural History** was presented together with the Fayetteville Area Transportation & Local History Museum took customers on a guided walk through downtown Fayetteville with descriptions of the architectural history of the buildings.

YS Library Associate Whitney Simmons shared that the participants of the **Tween Writing** program are very enthusiastic about their writing. They enjoy meeting and developing ideas for stories, and are eager to attend more writing sessions.

By her account, she did 90% of the work from the library, including getting help from staff in researching businesses and printing flyers for her grand opening using the library's computers. - ★ A customer told IS Librarian II Nathan Whitt, "Now I can breathe!" after he taught her how to connect her MacBook Air to a projector. She was required to give a presentation as part of a class project but she was worried about not being able to connect her laptop to a projector. Whitt went over the different ports on her computer and explained what kind of adapter she needed. She purchased the correct adapter and came back to the library. Whitt then helped her connect her computer to one of the library's projectors to give her practice. When her presentation came up on screen, she was visibly relieved.

- ★ A customer came to the library with her daughter who had been told by her teacher to use a library database for a homework assignment due the next day, but could not remember which database it was, or how to access it. The daughter recognized it as the correct database and used it to find the fun fact needed for the homework assignment. The customer told Davis, "Thank you for saving the day!"

IS Librarian I Brianna Davis hosted the **Fresh Start: Smoking Cessation** program which is a series of three classes. Two representatives of the Cumberland County Department of Public Health introduced smokers to tools they could use to assist their efforts to quit, and provided support, advice and encouragement to attendees. Attendees were very grateful for the program.

At the **Musical Train Ride with the Fayetteville Symphony Orchestra** program some very excited youth took imaginary train rides accompanied by a series of wonderful songs performed by the orchestra.
