## Highlights:

Book-A-Librarian sessions included assisting 56 customers with job applications, resumes and cover letters to businesses such as Cape Fear Valley Medical Center, Cumberland County Schools, Falcon Children's Home, the Federal Emergency Management Agency, the National Autism Society, Smithfield Foods, Sykes and Walmart. Staff taught customers how to create business fliers, how to create email accounts to receive and track job assignments and how to update employment credentials such as Certified Nursing Assistant certifications. Staff also trained other staff members on how to access databases to help with creating business plans.


## **Customer Comments/Success Stories:**

The library presented a multi-part *Job Search Bootcamp* series with topics covering "search secrets & strategies," "writing resumes and cover letters," "finding insider information on job prospects," and "acing the interview."

The Cliffdale Regional library hosted *From Combat Boots to Work Shoes* led by staff from *NCWorks*. The program was designed for veterans seeking to enter the post-military workforce. Topics included: information on resumes, cover letters, interviews, and the *NCWorks* website. Cliffdale Regional library also hosted *Planting the CEED: Basics of Business Growth*, which was presented by staff from the Center for Economic Empowerment and Development (CEED). The program provided small business owners with ten steps for planning, growing and nurturing their businesses.
